

2004-05 Alternative Education Accountability Campus Registration Form

A Campus Registration Form must be completed and returned to TEA for **each campus** requesting alternative education accountability (AEA) registration. **Incomplete forms and those received after September 10, 2004 will not be processed.**

Additional criteria for AEA registration may be imposed for 2005 during the development process of AEA procedures. New criteria could result in registered alternative education campuses (AECs) being removed from the list for 2005.

An AEC must serve “students at risk of dropping out of school” as defined in TEC §29.081(d). The following types of campuses **are not eligible** to be evaluated under AEA ratings procedures:

- disciplinary alternative education programs (DAEPs);
- juvenile justice alternative education programs (JJAEPs); and
- stand-alone GED programs.
