

## 2005-06 Alternative Education Accountability (AEA) Campus Registration Form

An **AEA Campus Registration Form** must be completed and returned to the Texas Education Agency (TEA) for **each campus** requesting registration for evaluation under alternative education accountability (AEA) procedures. **Incomplete forms and those received after August 31, 2005 will not be processed.**

Registered alternative education campuses (AECs) must serve “students at risk of dropping out of school” as defined in the Texas Education Code (TEC) §29.081(d). The following types of campuses **are not eligible** for evaluation under AEA procedures:

- disciplinary alternative education programs (DAEPs);
- juvenile justice alternative education programs (JJAEPs); and
- stand-alone General Educational Development (GED) programs.

Beginning in 2006, an **at-risk registration criterion** will be implemented. Each registered AEC must have at least 65% at-risk students enrolled on the registered AEC verified through current year Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) fall enrollment data in order to be evaluated under AEA procedures.

The requirements in criterion 9 apply to Residential Facilities only if students are placed in the facility by the district.
