

2006-07 Alternative Education Accountability (AEA) Campus Registration Form

An **AEA Campus Registration Form** must be completed and returned to the Texas Education Agency (TEA) for **each campus** requesting registration for evaluation under (AEA) procedures. **Incomplete forms and those postmarked after September 22, 2006 will not be processed.**

Registered alternative education campuses (AECs) must serve “students at risk of dropping out of school” as defined in the Texas Education Code (TEC) §29.081(d). The following types of campuses **are not eligible** for evaluation under AEA procedures:

- disciplinary alternative education programs (DAEPs);
- juvenile justice alternative education programs (JJAEPs); and
- stand-alone General Educational Development (GED) programs.

IMPORTANT: AEA At-Risk Registration Criterion

In order to be evaluated under 2007 AEA procedures, each registered AEC must have at least 70% at-risk students enrolled on the AEC verified through 2006-07 Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) fall enrollment data. **This criterion could result in registered AECs being removed from the list for 2007.** You will be notified in April 2007 if you do not meet the AEA at-risk registration criterion and, as a result, will be evaluated under standard accountability procedures in 2007.

5. Does the AEC offer nontraditional settings and methods of instructional delivery designed to meet the needs of the students served on the AEC?

7. Does the AEC have appropriately certified teachers assigned in all areas including special education, bilingual education, and/or English as a second language (ESL) to serve students eligible for such services?
