Outcome for Scenario 2-C: When all test results do not meet the passing standard, then the most recent test is chosen. The test result (fail) from the spring 2013 administration is attributed to Campus B. The test result (fail) from the summer 2012 administration is not attributed to Campus A.

The test result (pass) from the fall 2012 administration is not attributed to Campus B. The test result (fail) from the summer 2012 administration is not attributed to Campus A.
